Affordable Housing Ownership Program

Mayor Johnson announced visitors from Mississippi with the CCFC.

Kaedne Robinson outlined CCFC's role in the program.

Holden Foley requests approval for the Phase I and Phase II Pilot Projects that will serve as the foundation to provide for the continuance of a twofold long-range Affordable Housing Ownership Program in the City of Apalachicola to benefit its low income residents.

Phase I: Provides a grant match toward a complete affordable housing ownership package to construct one – 1500 to 1800 square foot "single-family" residence contingent upon certain requirements being met by the selected future homeowner. This phase will provide a \$20,000 grant match allocation toward a complete affordable housing ownership package. The sole purpose of this allocation is to be used toward the purchase of a buildable lot within the City, inclusion for the cost of infrastructure and building lot preparation needs will be acceptable (i.e.: electric, water/sewer connections, survey, clearing; etc.).

Phase II: Provides a loan match and surplus property donation toward a complete affordable housing ownership package to construct two – 800 to 1000 square foot workman style cottages that will serve as two affordable owner-residential units. This phase will provide an \$80,000 loan allocation and the contribution of two dedicated building sites, suggested property owned by the City of Apalachicola located west of 24th Avenue in Block 222. This loan allocation and property will be utilized solely toward a complete affordable housing ownership package.
